What is the Presbyterian

Scholarship Fund?

The Presbyterian Scholarship Fund was established in 1843 to provide scholarships for Presbyterian students at seven Presbyterian related colleges within Western Pennsylvania, Ohio and West Virginia. Board members are elected from eight presbyteries from the western half of the Synod of the Trinity to manage and develop the funds necessary to provide financial aid to qualified students. Using proceeds from current investments, the fund provides \$33,600 in aid annually for 28 students. The board recently began an active campaign to secure new gifts that will enable more scholarships to be awarded.

PROVIDES

The fund provides to freshman students who:

- ◆ **Need:** have demonstrated financial need. Need eligibility is determined by the financial aid office of the college
- ◆ **Church Affiliation:** are members of a congregation of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) within the bounds of the following presbyteries: Beaver-Butler, Kiskiminetas, Lake Erie, Pittsburgh, Redstone, Shenango, Upper Ohio Valley and Washington.

◆ **College:** have been accepted for admission to and enrollment in a full course of study leading to a degree at one of the following colleges: Davis and Elkins, Grove City, Muskingum, Washington and Jefferson, Waynesburg and Westminster.

The scholarship is renewable provided the student meets the school's requirements for continued eligibility.

A Brief History and Summary Of The Presbyterian Scholarship Fund

In 1843 The Board of Colportage was founded by the Synod of Pittsburgh as a Depository for Christian Literature. The work was known for many years as the Presbyterian Book Store located in Pittsburgh. In 1956 a Scholarship Program was inaugurated to aid and assist worthy young people of our churches to attend certain area colleges. When the Presbyterian USA and the United Presbyterian NA churches merged in 1958, Westminister Book Store purchased the Presbyterian Book Store. With the proceeds of the sale invested, the Board continues the Scholarship Aid Program.

The seven participating colleges are Davis and Elkins, Grove City, Muskingham, Washington and Jefferson, Waynesburg, Westminister and Wooster

The scholarship aid is for four years. Twenty-eight scholarships are in force with seven new Freshman scholarships awarded each year. If a student drops out, that student will be replaced by a student in the same class.

Eligibility: To be eligible for the scholarship aid an applicant must:

1. be a member with demonstrated financial need of a Presbyterian congregation in one of the following Presbyteries in the Synod of the Trinity: Beaver-Butler, Kiskiminetas, Lake Erie, Pittsburgh, Redstone, Shenango, Upper Ohio Valley and Washington;
2. be acceptable for admission to and enrollment in a full course of study leading to a degree in one of the participating colleges;
3. have or have available sufficient financial resources of scholarship aid in addition to that applied for to cover the remaining college expenses and
4. have been designated by the appropriate officer or committee of the participating college for the receipt of scholarship aid as fully meeting the above enumerated eligibility requirements and as qualifying under the whole body of principles observed by the participating college in awarding its other scholarship aid.

One Freshman scholarship will be available for award in each academic year at each participating college. Each recipient of a Freshman scholarship shall be eligible for scholarship aid during the Sophomore, Junior and Senior years provided he or she maintains a creditable academic standing in the class and is certified as continuing to be otherwise eligible for such scholarship aid by the appropriate official of the participating college.

The Fund is administered by a Board consisting of a representative from each of the eight participating Presbyteries. The Fund is managed by Cashdollar and Associates of Grove City, PA.
