

Introducing... The Rev. Drew Himes, Main Presenter

The Rev. Drew Himes is currently Pastor of the Atwood and Plumville Presbyterian Churches. Prior to ordination he served as an adult outpatient therapist at the largest community mental health and substance addiction practice in Southwest Pennsylvania. While there, he worked on both the adult mental health and the adult alcohol and other drugs units where he provided therapy services to large and small groups on numerous topics; led a three-day per week intensive outpatient addiction recovery program; taught in the all-day adult partial hospital programs for both mental health and addiction; and provided individual counseling. His individual practice focused most heavily in the areas of substance addiction, sexual trauma/PTSD and personality disorders. In addition to practical experience, he has received nearly 80 hours of specialized training beyond graduate school from the Pennsylvania Department of Drug and Alcohol Programming.

Rev. Himes holds his bachelor of arts degree from Westminster College; his Master of Divinity from Pittsburgh Theological Seminary; and Master of Social Work (with Graduate Certificate in Mental Health) from the University of Pittsburgh. He is currently licensed to practice social work in the Commonwealth.

Rev. Himes has not only faced the issue of addiction in the treatment milieu, but also on the street. He is a state certified Emergency Medical Technician who has unfortunately been present on far too many overdose calls, many of which were fatal. He has taught about addiction and mental illness to groups of police, fire and EMS personnel.

Having experienced the costs and struggles of addiction firsthand, Rev. Himes hopes that the information provided will give a wealth of tools that can be used to help end this horrible and destructive disease.
