We host a live nativity, free hot meal, and fellowship for the community. We involve the local high school, and all of our church's organizations. There is a petting zoo, music, crafts, and visit from Santa to teach the true meaning of Christmas.

How do you feel called to reach out to address the emerging needs of your community or constituency:

Our church prides itself in music. We have an accomplished pianist/organist and talented choir that bring an essence to worship. They sing beautiful songs that glorify God and touch people's souls.

We have made great strides, and with the help of our new pastor, we hope to further expand our outreach.
